What's Lent Got to Do With It?

As I think about the state of American Christianity and Christianity throughout the world, I find myself asking (in the immortal words of Tina Turner) "What's love got to do with it?" What's love got to do with what is happening in our country and around the world in the name of the One who came to teach us how to love God and love one another?

Love, it seems, is a scarce commodity in these times. We witness division, conflict, and injustice across the globe, and it is easy to conclude that love has little to do with the unfolding events. Yet, it is precisely in these moments of despair and disconnect that we are called to embody the radical love that Jesus exemplified. The love that forgives, heals, and bridges divides. It is this love that can transform our hearts and, by extension, the world around us.

As we enter this time of Lent and reflect on Jesus' journey to Jerusalem and his death at the hands of the Roman Empire, we are to reflect on how we are called to love during Lent. **Lent begins with Ash Wednesday (March 5th)** and for the next 40 days, you are invited to take on a practice, or fast from an activity as a way to connect more deeply with our God of love. If fasting from social media or Facebook for 40 days, or deleting your Amazon app or giving up your Starbucks run and giving the money you would have spent to **One Great Hour of Sharing** will help you connect more deeply with God's love, do it. If spending more time in devotion or prayer helps more, do that. But remember that it's about eliminating the things that interfere with or taking up the things that will help with our relationship with God.

Lent offers us a vital opportunity to pause, reflect, and recalibrate our lives in alignment with the teachings of Jesus. Amidst the prevailing turmoil and disarray, Lent calls us to a season of introspection and transformation, encouraging us to consciously create space for divine love to permeate our hearts and actions.



In a world rife with polarization and strife, Lent challenges us to become beacons of hope and reconciliation. It invites us to practice empathy, seek justice, and extend grace in our interactions with others. Through intentional practices that foster a deeper connection with God, we can cultivate an unwavering commitment to love one that transcends differences and heals wounds.

Join us for a simple and brief contemplative service of music, candles and imposition of ashes as a way to begin Lent.



sion Summarz At its Tuesday, February 25th meeting your session members met and discussed being a Spirit-led "sailboat church" after reading chapter two of the book titled Sailboat Church: Helping Your Church Rethink Its Mission and Practice. This kind of congregation earnestly seeks and strives to follow the God's leading. Your Elders believe that JCPC can make a difference in the Florence community if we continue striving to be this kind of church.

Gary Pierce, who was celebrating his birthday that evening, inspired the members with his devotion noting numerous Bible verses which mention laughter. Action items included a motion to extend invitations to ten New Harmony Presbytery ministers and elders to preach during Pastor Jen's Sabbatical. Many of these pastors have previously served as pulpit supply so you will know many of them.

March 16 was approved as PADD Sunday with a special offering to be provided the the Presbyterian Agency for the Developmentally Disabled – the organization that provides housing for adults with disabilities in three community based homes in Florence.

A designated account for The John Calvin Celebration Fund was approved so that we can collect small donations for the endowment and submit those funds to the endowment periodically. The session also approved communion at a noon service on Good Friday instead of a Maundy Thursday service. Myra Horton reported on meetings with Chris Webb, a landscape and playground designer who will be guiding the construction of the JCPC "backyard sanctuary." She is exploring grants which would aid in the project.
